Did You Know

On July 16th, 2022, the 10-digit National Suicide Prevention Lifeline transitioned to 988 – an easy-to-remember three-digit number for 24/7 crisis care. The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline is a network of more than 200 state and local call centers supported by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The lifeline, which also links to the Veterans Crisis Line, is the culmination of a three-year joint effort by various federal agencies to put crisis care in reach for people in need.
