PRIOR AUTHORIZATION METRICS FOR MEDICAL ITEMS AND SERVICES (EXCLUDING DRUGS)

To comply with the CMS Interoperability and Prior Authorization [final rule](#), Aetna Better Health® of Michigan is required to annually report aggregated prior authorization metrics on our website. Specifically, this includes a list of all medical items and services (excluding drugs) that require prior authorization, as well as data on prior authorization requests for those items and services (e.g., approvals, denials, etc.) over the previous calendar year. Publicly reporting these metrics promotes transparency and accountability, helps patients understand prior authorization processes, and enables providers to evaluate payer performance. 2025 Key Highlights

Prior to January 1, 2026, impacted payers are required to send prior authorization decisions within the following timeframes:

- For Medicaid managed care plans and CHIP managed care entities, 72 hours for **expedited requests** (urgent) and 14 calendar days for **standard requests** (non-urgent)

Beginning January 1, 2026, the CMS Interoperability and Prior Authorization [final rule](#) require Medicaid managed care plans to send prior authorization decisions within:

- 72 hours for **expedited requests** (urgent)
- 7 calendar days for **standard requests** (non-urgent)
